Attendance Updates

We have now sent out details of the new attendance policy which St John's will adopt from September 2024. This is the attendance policy from the Priory Federation of Academies Trust and can be found here. It is important to be aware that the new policy does include the issuing of fixed penalty notices (fines) for unauthorised absences, including term time holidays. The local authority issues these on behalf of the school.

Any planned absence from school should be requested through an absence request form available here or from the school office. These should then be returned to the Headteacher. According to the Education Regulations 2013, Headteachers can only grant absence in 'exceptional circumstances.'

A list of academy holidays is available on our website. This list will help you to plan your own holidays to coincide with academy holidays thus avoiding any loss of schooling for your child. There is a close link between attendance and progress.

As always, if you wish to discuss your child's attendance or the support available, then please contact the school.

Year 4 Online Safety

Year 5 British Council Project

Over 2 years ago, St John's got in touch with the British Council to be paired with a partner school in a different country to communicate on issues affecting our communities. This year, Year 5 were paired with a school in Egypt. Last week, the children showcased what they have been doing in a class assembly to their families. They highlighted how global warming and climate changing are impacting our environment,

including through the flooding which has worsened in recent years. It was so reassuring to see the children as our future generation caring deeply about this and sharing tips for how we can prevent climate change having such a negative impact on our world. I was so proud of them!

Earth Day 2024

On Monday, it was Earth Day with the theme this year being Planet vs. Plastics. KS2 had this as the focus for their assembly where we discussed why we need to reduce our use of single use plastics and some tips we can follow to protect our planet. The children in Reception class came back to class last week to a lovely surprise installed over the break. The playhouse will be a fantastic role play area to support and enhance the outdoor provision. It is currently acting as the 3 bears' cottage! ADHD Lincolnshire Parent Session

Ensuring we support pupils with SEND and their families is really important to us at St John's. We're delighted to be working with ADHD Lincolnshire to offer parents an information session delivered by an expert from the charity who has a wealth of knowledge around supporting pupils with ADHD or those with general attention and focus difficulties. We would welcome any parents to attend this session at St John's on <u>Tuesday 2nd July from</u> <u>2.30—3.20pm.</u> Your child does not need to be on the SEND register or have a diagnosis of ADHD. If your child struggles with any attention, focus or





impulsivity issues then the strategies shared will be useful. There will be the opportunity to ask questions and to speak about your child if desired. The staff will then also receive a training session after school to continue the important development of our own awareness and knowledge of SEND and how to support pupils with ADHD in the classroom.



Wedding bells!

There are wedding bells ringing all around St John's as we congratulate Miss Richardson who got married over the Easter holidays and Miss Opie who is due to get married over the May half term. Miss Richardson will become Mrs Pook from September with her new class and Miss Opie is becoming Mrs Opie-Skinner from after May half term. Before the Easter holidays, we took a small team of Y5/6 pupils to Sir William Robertson Academy to take part in a Maths competition. There were different rounds, including group rounds, speed rounds and logic rounds. Out of 12 schools taking part, St John's took 3rd place with 152 points. What an amazing achievement and some great determination from the pupils involved.
