Our aim is to try and be in the green for our overall attendance across the year!


Attendance

Learning in Class



Year 3

As part of their history topic learning about the Stone Age, Year 3 made Stone Age inspired jewellery. They worked as a class to make some salt dough which they then used to make beads. They thought about what Stone Age beads would have looked like. Year 3 are very excited to link their English writing to this as they write instructions so that others can have as much fun as they did and make their own jewellery!
