Our aim is to try and be in the green for our overall attendance across the year!


Attendance

Our school attendance for the year is currently above the National Average figures. Our persistent absence (the % of children with less than 90% attendance) is lower than the National Average figures. This is something for us to really celebrate. I'd like to thank our families for recognising the impact of good attendance on children's outcomes and experiences. We can, and do, continue to offer support where children may be struggling with their attendance and work with families together on this. Attendance was an area for us to improve following the last OFSTED inspection so these positive improvements are something to really celebrate.



Our class challenge continues and at the moment, this early on in the term, it could be any class who takes the lead in this. Our 100 club has also re-started and another group of children will be selected from our wheel spinner if they've had 100% attendance in Term 3. I look forward to seeing how many children we have on our wheel—it was certainly a lot last term!







Children's Mental Health Week

This week is Children's Mental Health Week. The theme this year is 'Know yourself, grow yourself.' Our children have taken part in numerous activities this week aimed to develop their own awareness of what type of activity they can do to promote positive mental health. In year groups, children had the opportunity to choose and sign up to an activity which they thought would best promote their positive wellbeing. Then the children took part in that activity. This was to encourage their own decision making and sense of responsibility for looking after and prioritising their wellbeing. It was lovely to see children taking part in very different activities but all designed to help the children feel good about themselves! There is lots of useful advice to help support young people here should families be interested. Thank you to Mrs Smallacombe for co-ordinating this across the school and making this a fantastic week for all our children.











Learning in class



Year 5—Planetarium

To support with the children's Science learning about Earth and Space, the Planetarium came to our school hall! The children gathered inside the dome and learned all about the planets of our solar system, understanding their complexities and what makes them so unique. They learnt all about the space race and learned that the Russians actually sent two tortoises around the moon before the moon landing by USA in 1969. The children



then had the opportunity to gaze upon the stars and learn all about the constellations we can see in the night sky. They identified Orion the Hunter, Orion's Belt, Andromeda, Aquarius, Leo and Cancer to name a few. The children had a fantastic time and learned so much alongside the knowledge they demonstrated brilliantly through our topic so far!

Year 6—STEM Learning at IBCC

Our Year 6 pupils had the opportunity to go to the International Bomber Command Centre to complete some STEM activities (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) The children took part in activities including a theory of flight workshop to discuss which factors would enable a plane to fly best before testing and designing their own. They also developed their Coding skills by building a lego robot and creating code on the iPads to enable the robot to perform a variety of tasks. Finally, the children learnt about some of the amazing technology used by Bomber Command during WW2. What a brilliant day for our pupils!







Year 4—Pizza Express

Before Christmas, 4T had a visit to Pizza Express as part of their Design and Technology learning and this time it was the turn of 4D. The children learnt all about adapting recipes, trying ingredients and, of course, got to make their very own delicious pizzas!

Year 2

Year 2 have started to explore using clay in their Art lessons. They have used the score, slip and blend technique to make joins in clay. They have then applied these skills to start creating their dragons' eyes. Next week, they will paint them and glaze them. I think they look absolutely brilliant.









As part of their Roman topic, Year 3 had the opportunity to explore Roman Lincoln, once known as Lindum Colonia. They walked through the upper part of the city, discovering the remains of the four Roman gates that once allowed entry into this settlement. The children also examined the defensive walls, which would have protected the Colonia from invaders. They also explored how



the Roaring meg spring supplied water via an aqueduct into a reservoir and visited a Roman bathhouse, discovering its impressive underground heating system. The children were able to admire Roman architecture including the Mint Wall and the site of the colonnades. We are very lucky to live in a city so rich in History!

We are so proud that the staff at St John's seek to continually improve and further develop and then bring this knowledge and new skills into our school to impact on our



children. The culture that we are all life-long learners will hopefully inspire our pupils. It has been a lot of hard work for these teachers and we're very proud of their achievements!

Safer Internet Day

Next week on Tuesday 11th February, it is Safer Internet Day. The theme this year is 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online.' We know that we live in a digital world where it can be easy to fall for scams online and that usually if something looks too good to be true then it usually is. We will be sharing tips with the children

about staying safe online and about what information they should not be sharing online. We will look at how easy it can be to think something is legitimate and to pass over details and then what scammers can do with this information. Parents / carers can access some top tips here for protecting their families from online scams. There's also some fantastic resources here for children to access at an age-appropriate level. We will be accessing some of these as part of our lessons on this day.

This was the first time this event has happened and it included all of the singing groups from the Priory Trust Primary schools coming together to perform in front of a packed audience of families and staff.
