Attendance

We have had chicken pox move through St John's over the last couple of weeks which is why our attendance has been low. This happens in school when you have children in close proximity to one another and so nothing can be done, however we seem to be coming out the other side of this which is good news for everyone!

Our school attendance for the year is currently above the National Average figures. Our persistent absence (the % of children with less than 90% attendance) is lower than the National Average figures. This is something for us to really celebrate. I'd like to thank our families for recognising the impact of good attendance on children's outcomes and experiences. We can, and do, continue to offer support where children may be struggling with their attendance and work with families together on this. Attendance was an area for us to improve following the last OFSTED inspection so these positive improvements are something to really celebrate.

Our class attendance challenge for the term is underway and it's currently a tie between Miss Richardson's class and Mrs Tasker's class! I wonder if they will hold on to their lead or if another class might sneak past them. We still have 4 more weeks of the challenge left!

Learning in class



Year 2

Year 2 had a fabulous trip to Lincoln Castle last week as part of their History learning about important Lincoln buildings! They learnt lots of interesting information all about Lincoln Castle and had the opportunity to walk around the walls—seeing some lovely views all across Lincoln.









Year 3

This term, Year 3 are learning about eating seasonal fruit and vegetables grown in the UK. As part of this learning they learnt how to safely peel and chop a range of foods which can be grown in the UK during this time of the year. This included potatoes, apples, pears, radish, spring onions, cucumber and asparagus. They loved trying some of the food during the lesson to compare flavours. Lots of us loved the cucumber, apples and pears. However, the stronger flavours from the spring onion and radish were more debated! They will use this knowledge to help design their own seasonal tarts which they will be making later in the term alongside our food safety knowledge too.









Year 6

Year 6 have been getting into the groove with their disco moves this term. Iconic moves such as the disco finger, the hustle, the bump and the funky chicken have been causing all sorts of fun and excitement! The children have listened to 'You to me are Everything' by the Real Thing and then using their listening and appraising skills to describe the music using terminology such as pitch, tempo and timbre. They have then compared the original to cover versions including Sonia to The Overtones. The children have given opinions about their favourites with excellent reasons to back up their answers. They have also enjoyed learning the song 'Celebration' - I think they might have to sing that one after SATs!

Year 4

Year 4 had a First Aid Workshop with Mini First Aid Lincs as part of their PSHE learning around keeping safe. They learnt some basic first aid and what they should do in an emergency. They practiced how to give CPR and how to put someone in the recovery position. It's so important that children know some basic skills as we never know when they may find themselves in a position needing to use them. They did a fantastic job! Well done Year 4.







British Science Week

We were so fortunate this week to welcome Siemens into our school for British Science Week. They came to do some STEM activities with pupils in Year 3 and Year 5. The children learnt about how power is created and considered the effect of these methods on the environment. They made their own windmills and designed circuit systems which made balls float, doorbells ring and turbines turn. It was very exciting. We can't wait to continue celebrating science with our own science week next term. Thank you so much to Siemens for coming in and providing this opportunity.


Swimming Success


