

Extra-Curricular Clubs

Autumn 2024/25





Extra-Curricular clubs and activities support children in developing interests and passions and are something we place great importance on. We are proud of the breadth of clubs we are able to offer. This booklet will show our offer for September 2024—December 2024. Our extensive programme will offer the children the chance to develop skills which go beyond the school curriculum.

What kinds of opportunities will be available to my child?

We have carefully considered the range of provision on offer to cover art, sport, STEM, language and literacy and community. You may notice slightly more clubs on offer for KS2 than KS1. We have increased the number of clubs available for pupils in KS1 and will continue to look at our offer.

Who will be running these sessions?

A significant number of sessions will be run by external providers who are experts in their fields. We are delighted to have built strong relationships with these providers and that our pupils get the chance to benefit from their knowledge, skill and experience. A number of sessions will be run by the school staff team who will be giving their time to offer children these opportunities after school.

Why is there a charge for some clubs?

Due to the high quality of external providers, some clubs require a charge to ensure they can be offered to pupils and have the capacity to run. It also covers the use of resources which may be needed to run the club. Pupils who are in receipt of pupil premium are entitled to a 50% reduction in the cost of the after school club.

Why do children need to commit to a full term?

Numerous research studies highlight the academic and social benefits of sustained extra curricular engagement. Just like clubs the children may attend at weekends, the longer children commit to developing a new skill, the more successful they are likely to become.

We have therefore decided that children should therefore 'commit' at least 1 big term (Autumn, Spring or Summer) to developing a new skill before reviewing if they wish to continue.

For some clubs, children who are already signed up will get the option to continue this into the next term before any additional places are offered out.

How do I book?

You can register your interest for different clubs by using the hyperlinks in this booklet which will take you to an online form.

The window for registering for clubs starting in September will be Monday 17th June— Friday 28th June. After this deadline, we will contact families to let them know whether their child has a place on the club. All after school clubs will begin the week beginning 9th September 2024. Payment will need to be received before your child is able to start the club.


