
### **Safeguarding Updates**

# **Learning in Class**



#### Year 1

In Year 1 the children (and staff!) have been very excited to start the Little Wandle phonics scheme. They are enjoying reading all of our lovely new books. The children take part in 3 reading group sessions a week where they focus on a different skill each time: fluency, prosody and comprehension. They will then be bringing the books home to share with you the results of all their hard work in class!


In Art, the children in Year 1 have been exploring all the different marks we can make and trying out lots of different drawing tools. They look very proud of their work and rightly so! Great job Year 1!

The children also had a very exciting afternoon this week, going on a local walk as part of their Geography learning looking for human and physical features in our local area. They found houses, shops and a church as well as trees, hedges and other physical features. Fantastic fieldwork Year 1!



### Year 5

Year 5 have been writing non-chronological reports about their History topic of the Kingdom of Benin. I'm so impressed with the quality of work they are producing in their books! In Science lessons, the children have been experimenting with different forces and have started by observing the effects of gravity and air resistance. The children also used Newton meters to compare the friction produced by different surfaces found on and around the playground. Great investigating Year 5!





# **Curriculum and Learning**



#### **Little Wandle Information Session**

We had a parents information session for our new Reception families this week to introduce them to how phonics is taught using our new scheme and how support can be given at home. If you missed the session, then the information will be put on tapestry. We assess pupils regularly on what sounds they are learning and how many they are remembering. We will share these assessments with you too so that you know where some extra practice may be helpful!



#### Clubs

We have had some brilliant after school clubs start this term. I walked into gardening club this week to find the children absolutely thrilled at how messy they were getting making some brilliant bird feeders. Ukulele club has also been a huge hit. I got to see the children practicing some of what they had learnt this week and I was blown away by how much progress they have made in just over 3 weeks. I've been promised a little performance if I go back next week which I can't wait for. Choir with Mrs Ballard are already practicing Christmas songs as they are very in demand, being booked up for performances across the festive period!





#### Admissions to Reception in September 2026

All schools are required to consult on their admissions arrangements every seven years, even if no changes are being proposed. Under that seven-year rule, we are about to consult on our arrangements for admission to our Reception Class in September 2026. 
Please note that because this is a whole school assembly, we don't have any spare room for families but I'll include photos in the next newsletter.

Let's help decorate a very St John's festive tree!


